Background

TECT is a community trust; people are at the heart of everything we do. We invest in communities to create a thriving, caring and connected Western Bay of Plenty for all.

The origins of TECT hail from the government's electricity reforms of the 1990s. A restructure of the Trust was completed on 23 February 2022, marking the end of a long process to ensure that TECT continues to bring long-lasting benefits to the Tauranga and Western Bay communities, while future-proofing the rebate for existing beneficiaries. As part of this change a new long-term community trust was established focused on grants for local community projects. This new Trust has been operational from 1 April 2022.

TECT's focus is on investing wisely and granting effectively to support transformational, intergenerational change in our region. Funds are distributed through our grant-making and bring to life grassroots organisations and large-scale, multi-million-dollar projects alike.

At approximately \$1 billion, the TECT asset base is one of the largest in the country. Approximately 45% of TECT's assets are held in a diversified portfolio that includes a range of national and international investments. The remainder is made up of a 26.8% shareholding in Manawa Energy Ltd. A key part of the Trustees role is being a responsible steward of these funds.

TECT's granting budget this year is \$27M. Another key part of the Trustees role is determining what community groups and projects should receive funds. This requires strong knowledge of the communities and their needs.

The TECT Community Trust is governed by six trustees who are elected by local residents for 4-year terms. The terms of appointment of trustees are staggered so that three trustees retire every two years. Trustees elected to the TECT Community Trust will automatically be appointed to TECT Holdings Ltd (which holds the Manawa Energy Ltd Shares), and to the TECT Consumer Trust (which pays the rebates). Note that the rebate amount is prescribed in the TECT Consumer Trust Deed and there is no discretion for this to be increased (or decreased).

Who can vote – Previously only Trustpower customers were eligible to vote. Following a restructure, TECT is now a community trust and the trustees are now elected by those electors enrolled on either the Tauranga City Council or Western Bay of Plenty District Council electoral rolls.
