## Dear Consumers,

In a year in which the New Zealand economy has been severely impacted by the global financial crisis and by natural disasters, TECT has provided important benefits to the Tauranga economy through its distributions to Consumers and Consumer Organisations.

## **TrustPower**

TECT was formed to hold shares in the listed electricity generator retailer, TrustPower. TECT's major investment remains its 33% shareholding in that Company.

In the year under review, TECT received dividends from TrustPower of \$39.5m, down from \$47.8m last year. Although total dividends were lower this year, ordinary dividends increased from 36c per share to 38c per share (dividends last year included a special dividend of 10c per share).

The value of the TrustPower investment at 31 March 2011 was \$7.20 per share compared to \$7.24 as at 31 March 2010.

Some brief details about TrustPower are worth mentioning because it is TECT's major investment.

In the ten years to 31 March 2010, Craig Investment Partners calculate that of the Companies listed on the NZX, TrustPower has provided the second highest returns.

As to the future, in the year under review, TrustPower successfully completed the 36 MW first stage of its Mahinerangi wind farm near Dunedin, on time and below budget. The Company secured resource consents for the development of hydro electric stations at Arnold (46 MW) near Greymouth, and at Wairau (72 MW) near Blenheim. These consents are significant because they are the only two major hydro consents achieved since the introduction of the Resource Management Act in 1991.

In a diversification of its business, TrustPower in December 2010, completed the commissioning of pumping equipment at Highbank, which is seen as an important first step in providing greater irrigation capacity to the Canterbury region.

As TrustPower develops these opportunities and others, Trustees are confident, that over time, the value of the

TrustPower investment and the dividends that flow from it will increase in line with the Company's strong past performance.

Key financial results for the year are as follows:

- · Group Equity increased by \$3.6m, an increase of 0.53%
- Short term money market deposits were \$19.8m including \$5.3m committed to TECT's funding reserves and distribution provisions
- Group Income was \$33.6m, compared to \$34.4m last year, a decrease of 2.3%
- Group Expenses decreased by \$1.8m, a decrease of 26.6%.
   This decrease is attributable to reduced interest costs as the result of reduced debt

Trustees consider the results pleasing in the current financial climate.

## **TECT's Distributions**

This year \$30.9m was allocated to TECT's Consumer Distribution Schemes. \$25.9m was distributed directly to Consumers through the annual cheque distribution scheme. This represented an average payment of \$446 per Consumer, making it a record distribution. Trustees were pleased to be able to do this at a time when most Consumers are facing difficult financial conditions.

TECT has now distributed over \$169m direct to Consumers since 1994, and the base amount has grown from \$20 per Consumer then, to \$360 in 2010. Trustees are pleased to have resolved this year to further increase the base amount of the November 2011 distribution from \$360 per customer to \$375 per customer, an increase of 4.2%. \$5m was allocated to TECT's other Consumer Community Organisation Schemes, and details of the grants made from those schemes are set out elsewhere in this report.

A review of these distributions will give you an insight into the many wonderful activities being undertaken in our community by our community organisations and the many passionate volunteers associated with them. Their work enriches our community and makes Tauranga a better place for all of us.

Where grants have been made to organisations to assist in the provision of community amenities, those grants have been made on the basis that reasonable access to those amenities is to be afforded to Consumers generally. This has added significantly to the variety of amenities now available to Consumers.

While each of the grants detailed in this report has brought benefit to the Consumers receiving it, it has been particularly pleasing to again support the TrustPower/TECT helicopter in the vital work it does. A grant to the Lions Club Cancer Hostel at Hamilton will assure accommodation for those of us in need of critical treatment, and we await with much anticipation, the opening in October of our newest major amenity, the indoor sports and exhibition centre TECT Arena at Baypark.

#### Trustees

Trustee elections were held in June 2010. Thank you to the eighteen candidates who presented themselves for election. The election saw Mr Ron Scott and I returned as Trustees, and we were joined by Dame Susan Devoy. Dame Susan has quickly settled into her work and adds greatly to the breadth of Trustee experience across a wide range of endeavours. Ron and Susan join me in thanking Consumers for their support. Frances Denz retired at our AGM last year. I commend Frances for her work on behalf of Consumers.

I acknowledge Trustees for their commitment and for their efforts on behalf of Consumers during the year.

#### Secretariat

Thanks too, to our Secretary Fraser Lellman, and to his team of Char Niles, Jeanette Voss and Judi Priest for their efforts on behalf of Consumers. They have all contributed strongly to the smooth and efficient running of TECT.

### Conclusion

Thank you for the opportunity of presenting this report. We as Trustees are placed by you in the very privileged position of overseeing the many benefits that TECT brings to our community. I hope you will enjoy this report, and agree that TECT remains worthy of your continued support.

# TURNING UP THE HEAT

Mr & Mrs Dijk of Te Puna had no insulation in their 1980's home. It was cold, damp and expensive to heat. They are among the 900,000 houses in New Zealand with insufficient or no insulation, where indoor temperatures fall well below World Health Organisation recommended limits.

TECT has contributed \$650,000 to the Tauranga Healthy Homes project since 2005. The focus of the project is to reach Consumers who can't afford to improve the energy efficiency of their homes. TECT's contribution and other local funding secured has enabled over 750 local homes to be retrofitted to date – a real benefit for the community. TECT has recently committed further funds to the Healthy Homes project which will enable another 400 local homes to be retrofitted.

The healthy homes package includes a home energy check plus ceiling and underfloor insulation, polythene ground covers, hot water cylinder wraps and pipe lagging, weather stripping and draft stopping around doors and windows.

We know this scheme is making a real difference in our community. TECT is proud to be involved in such a positive initiative and is delighted to be part of a project that improves health and energy efficiency, as well as making homes warmer and drier, especially for the elderly, and young children, who are vulnerable to the cold. Not only does the project create employment opportunities, but reduced power consumption is also good news for the environment.

## SURF LIFESAVERS READY TO COME TO THE RESCUE

Over the last 100 years, Surf Lifesaving has grown from humble beginnings on the shores of suburban beaches to become one of New Zealand's most honoured and respected volunteer organisations. New Zealand has thousands of beaches and millions of people visit them each year, but they can be a deadly playground. From the roaring surf to the treacherous rips, it is easy to be swept into danger.

New Zealand Surf Lifeguards are always ready to come to the rescue. While the yellow-and-red flag has remained a symbol of safety in the surf through the long summer months, the lifeguards are ever on the lookout for an upraised hand, with ears pricked for a cry for help. Last summer, New Zealand Surf Lifeguards performed over 100,000 preventative actions during 155,000 hours of beach patrols.

TECT has been more than happy to take the plunge and support our local Mount, Omanu, Papamoa, Maketu and Waihi Beach Surf Clubs with funding towards clubhouse upgrades, equipment, inflatable rescue boats and the Festival of Surf Sport Centennial Celebrations. Our local Clubs cater for some of the largest junior surf programmes in New Zealand with junior members being educated in beach safety, hazards, lifeguarding and competition while having fun at the same time. From the age of 5 years these "Nippers" are encouraged to develop their surf lifesaving knowledge and skills so that they can be more confident in the water and enjoy the beach.

Surf Lifesaving is a great activity that brings together service to the community with sport, recreation, loads of fun-filled summer days and friendships that last a lifetime – our partnership with Surf Lifesaving is one that we are extremely proud of.

## CONSUMER CHEQUE DISTRIBUTIONS

TECT distributes the majority of its annual income directly to Consumers by way of cheques. In November 2010, TECT distributed \$25,875,000 to eligible Consumers. Each Consumer received a fixed amount of \$360 plus a small amount which varied according to each Consumer's power usage. The average cheque amount was \$446. The cheque distribution is of significant benefit to Consumers and provides a huge cash injection into the local economy. To be eligible for the TECT cheque, you must be a TrustPower customer in TECT's District (basically in the Tauranga City or Western Bay of Plenty region) and have an active TrustPower power account continuously from

1 April to 30 September. This year each eligible Consumer will receive a fixed base amount of \$375 with cheques being mailed out in November.



## TRUST GOVERNANCE

TECT and its subsidiary TECT Charitable Trust operate under Deeds of Trust respectively dated 21 December 1993 and 27 March 2002. Provisions of the Electricity Amendment Act 2001 also impact upon Trust Governance. TECT's Consumers (approximately 62,000) are TrustPower power account holders located generally in the Tauranga City and the Western Bay of Plenty District.

TECT is governed by six Trustees who are elected by Consumers for 4-year terms. The terms of appointment of Trustees are staggered so that 3 Trustees retire

every 2 years. Trustees are responsible for managing TECT's assets for the benefit of qualifying Consumers. Trustee conduct is governed by a Code of Practice which is published on TECT's website.

The day-to-day operations of TECT are managed by the Trust Secretary, Mr Fraser Lellman, BDO Tauranga Limited. Chartered Accountants.

During the year, TECT amended its Deed to include a provision for Notice of Meetings to be sent to Trustees electronically.

# NOTES TO THE SUMMARISED CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

#### 1. REPORTING ENTITY

These are the Summarised Financial Statements for the TECT Group comprising Tauranga Energy Consumer Trust ("TECT"), TECT Charitable Trust, TECT Holdings Limited, TECT Finance Limited and TECT Finance No. 2 Limited.

The Tauranga Energy Consumer Trust was established under a Trust Deed on 21 December 1993 as a consequence of the Tauranga Electric Power Board's Establishment Plan. TECT is a Consumer Trust, the income and capital of which are to be used to provide benefits to Consumers who are TrustPower customers in the area defined in the Trust Deed (being the area supplied by the Tauranga Electric Power Board as at 21 December 1993 subsequently amended to include the Tauranga district area previously supplied by Tauranga Electricity Limited).

TECT is not a Charitable Trust and accordingly may not continue for more than 80 years. On the winding up of the Trust the assets of the Trust, which remain, will be distributed for the benefit of Consumers.

TECT Group holds 103,878,838 shares, representing 33% in the capital of TrustPower Limited.

### 2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The summary financial statements are prepared in accordance with FRS 43 Summary Financial Statements. The full financial statements have been prepared in accordance with New Zealand Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (NZ GAAP), as applicable for profit-oriented entities. The Trust has made an explicit and unreserved statement of compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) in its full financial statements.

This summary is extracted from the full financial statements authorised for issue by the Trustees on 22 June 2011, for which an unmodified audit opinion has been given. This summary has also been examined by KPMG and a copy of their summary unmodified audit opinion is included in this report.

The summary financial statements are presented in New Zealand dollars and rounded to the nearest dollar.

The summary financial statements cannot be expected to provide as complete an understanding as provided by the full financial statements of the Trust. You can obtain a copy of the full financial statements free of charge from the TECT office at 96 Cameron Road, Tauranga 3110 or the Trust's website www.tect.org.nz.

### 3. TAXATION

The tax charge debit of \$2,280,516 relates to current group tax charges of \$13,937,199 less dividend Imputation Tax Credits of \$11,679,276 plus deferred tax adjustment of \$22,593.

## 4. DEFERRED TAX

Deferred Tax shown in the Statement of Financial Position arises primarily from excess Imputation Credits which are able to be converted to tax losses and from revaluation of financial instruments to fair value.

## 5. IMPUTATION CREDITS

As TECT is not a company it does not have an Imputation Credit account. TECT Holdings Limited, TECT Finance Limited and TECT Finance No. 2 Limited are registered as an Imputation Group. As at 31 March 2011 the Group had Imputation Credits available of \$16,641,276 (2010: \$1,855,287).

### 6. COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

TECT Group had no commitments or contingencies at the end of the financial year other than those disclosed in the Statement of Financial Position. (2010: Nil)

## 7. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Mr Michael Cooney is Chairperson of Tauranga Energy Consumer Trust and TECT Charitable Trust. He is a Director of TECT Holdings Limited, TECT Finance Limited and TECT Finance No. 2 Limited and is also a Director of TrustPower Limited. Net dividends received by TECT Group from TrustPower Limited during the year ended 31 March 2011 totalled \$39,473,958 (2010: \$47,784,265). At 31 March 2011 the TECT Group shareholding in TrustPower Limited was 103,878,838 shares valued at \$7.20 per share (2010: \$7.24) or a total value of \$747,927,634 (2010: \$752,082,787).

Ms Frances Denz was a Trustee of Tauranga Energy Consumer Trust and TECT Charitable Trust and was also a Director of TECT Holdings Limited, TECT Finance Limited and TECT Finance No. 2 Limited until 29 July 2010. She was also a Director of Tauranga City Aquatics Limited. Net dividends received by TECT Group from Tauranga City Aquatics Limited during the year ended 31 March 2011 totalled \$234,764 (2010: \$228,357). At 31 March 2011 the TECT Group Redeemable Preference shareholding in Tauranga City Aquatics Limited was valued at \$4 million.

Trustees are required to be Consumers as defined in TECT's Trust Deed and are therefore beneficiaries of TECT and accordingly are related parties. All transactions with related parties are undertaken in the normal course of business on normal commercial terms.
